CALL TO THE PUBLIC

Sue Harris stated that ever since the barricades went up on Barnes Drive, traffic on 150 South has increased tremendously. Speeding cars are now using 150 South as a cut through street. One night she counted 25 cars on that street within 20 minutes and only one car stopped on the street. She believes that when the Council discusses Barnes Drive again they also need to consider traffic problems on 150 South.

Sara Thatcher thanked the Council for what they have done regarding safety in the roundabout on Angel Street, Smith Lane and Roueche Lane. She knows that the Parks Department will recommend 20 mph advisory speed through the roundabout but suggested that 15 mph signs be placed there instead.

Jaynalee Peterson thanked Council Member Stephens and Mayor Hiatt for placing flashing lights and a crossing guard at Tylers Way and Angel Street. She talked to UDOT and they recommend high plants in the middle of a roundabout because people who can see through a roundabout tend to drive faster. She believes 15 mph speed signs should also be placed there.

Lorene Kamalu explained that she has been helping businesses in the City. She recently visited Egan Automotive and was informed that during the construction on Flint Street, they had difficulty letting people know that they were open.
