CALL TO THE PUBLIC

Brian Van Camp expressed concerns regarding the West Creek Side Subdivision. When this subdivision was discussed a year ago it was important to him that a road go around the perimeter of the school. In this recent site plan, that perimeter road is missing and a jogging path has taken its place. He desires to have that road there because he believes it would be safer for children. He would prefer cars stay off the roads in the subdivision and use the perimeter road to park on during large school events. He is also concerned with allowing the developer to build the subdivision in phases because issues have come up with phasing subdivisions. This is not a large subdivision and he believes that phasing is not necessary. He would also like to see all improvements in the subdivision be done at one time.
