STRATEGIC PLAN WORK MEETING

Josh King, with The Langdon Group, explained that they are a consulting firm who have been working with Kaysville City to help create a Strategic Plan to help refine the vision of the city as a whole. They, along with city staff, have reached out to the community to see what they feel are where the city should be focusing and what they value most in the city. What they heard from the community is that the city should continue providing services such as police and fire, build and maintain necessary infrastructure, continue to maintain public parks and preserve open space. Some stated that they wished that there were more events and opportunities to be involved in. There were also comments about having diverse housing options throughout the community, and they wished that Kaysville had a better sense of place.

Derek Moss reviewed each of these ideas from the residents with the City Council and Planning Commission. They received the most responses from citizens about the importance of maintaining our infrastructure in the future, as well as addressing traffic.

The City Council and Planning Commission discussed the results found from the interviews done, and discussed what steps should be taken next.
